Wondering how to help your child retain information learned during preschool? Repetition and enthusiasm is the key. Here are a few fun and creative ways to incorporate letters and numbers into your daily routines:

Letters: Next time you go to the grocery store, choose a letter and have a letter search. Count how many of a particular letter you find or see who can find the most. Identify if the letter is upper or lowercase. Then see how many words you can think of that start with that letter; emphasizing the sound that letter makes.

<u>Numbers</u>: Count everything. Count their fingers and toes at bath time, pretzels at snack, cars, dolls, buttons on their shirt, etc. Once counting is mastered, begin searching for numbers when you are out and about. Gas station prices, phone numbers on a billboard. house numbers. etc.

Teaching your child about responsibility:

- Model Responsibility The most effective way to teach responsibility is to model responsibility frequently.
- Assign Individual Tasks Allow your child to help you with small tasks around the house.
- 3. Find Responsible Solutions Together share scenarios and situations with your child and ask them to suggest responsible solutions.
- 4. Offer Praise Positive reinforcement is an excellent way to demonstrate that their efforts are appreciated and important.
